Hello Residents :

The long anticipated refurbishing of the Houston-Fisher is now complete. As this article comes out the pool is open for the enjoyment of our residents and will give the youth of our city somewhere to go this summer. The pool with all new equipment and with proper yearly maintenance should last 15 years or more.

The Farmer's Market/Flea Market has started as of Saturday May 29 from 7 a.m. to 1 p.m. or longer at the City parking lot off Vine Street. For the cost of \$10 for up to three spaces, residents are welcome to clean out their garages and attics and sell the items at the Flea Market. The Chagrin River Salmon Association will hold a Kids Fishing Derby on Saturday June 5 from 9 a.m. until noon at the Eastlake seawall. After fishing there is a free lunch provided at their club, located on Erie Road. All participants will receive a door prize along with special prizes for largest fish caught. The Salmon Association provides the bait and advice and help with fishing. This derby historically has always been a very well run event for the kids of Eastlake with many valuable prizes given away at no cost to the participants.

This year we will hold our annual parade on Sunday July 4. Any group, sports league or individual can participate in the parade. A short application is available at City Hall or can be downloaded from our web site.
